Frequently Asked Questions

Friday & Saturday Competitions

1) Do match times vary division by division?

All Divisions will have game times varied each week unless a team has a special requirement to justify fixed times and the committee approves such a variation. Grading will result in games being fixtured at the same time to ensure the grading committee can view all teams within the same grade simultaneously.

Saturday Net Set Go competitions will always be the earliest time slots due to the difference in Pole height

3) Can I Choose to play Thursday or Friday Nights?

<u>Sorry but no</u> you cannot choose the night you play as the bottom 4 grades will always be on a Thursday night with the balance on Friday night. e.g., if there are 10 divisions then divisions 6-10 will be Thursday nights & Division 1-5 Friday night. This is to try and keep the competition at a reasonable time for our developing children.

4) How does grading occur?

Grading occurs across the first 2 weeks of the season, across 3 nights. All Teams need to be available on any designated night during this 2-week period. An appointed committee will assess all teams to determine a suitable grade. If for some reason a coach feels they have been miss graded, then they can contact LNA's Development Officer who will take the matter to the grading committee for consideration. Please note that after the due consideration the grading committee's decision is considered final. The grading committee will continue to monitor divisions for the first 3 weeks and reserves the right to adjust grades if required. Teams are not disadvantaged in this process.

5) What is our Jewellery Policy?

Due to legal/insurance reasons LNA has an absolutely NO jewellery policy. No jewellery can be worn <u>or</u> taped during a game unless it's a medic alert bracelet, which must be taped. This includes nose rings, belly button rings, or any other body piercing or any other jewellery be it made from metal or any other material, including hair accessories.

6) How do I become an Umpire?

LNA is proud of its umpiring program which generally starts when participants are in High School and have demonstrated a good playing understanding of the game. Should you wish to become an umpire

- a) Be turning age 12 in the current season
- b) tick the relevant box upon registration
- c) Complete the online umpiring exam <u>NETBALL LEARNING CENTRE UMPIRE</u>
- & achieve 70% or more, then emailing the result to leschenaultnetball@gmail.com
- d) participate in our beginners training program as advised by the umpire coordinator
- e) Refer to our website for further information

7) I am Short can I use a fill in player?

Fill in players from an LNA division below your level are allowed free of charge. If they do not play netball at all they are required to pay a fee at the court managers desk prior to entering the court for insurance purposes. If a player plays for an association there is still a fee for administration purposes to be paid prior to the game commencing. Please refer to the By Laws for further information. The exception to the division rule is for the year 3 & 4 program whereby player can play for any team within their own division as fill-ins as required should a team be short

8) How do I register a Team
